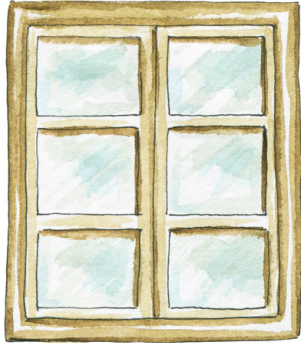

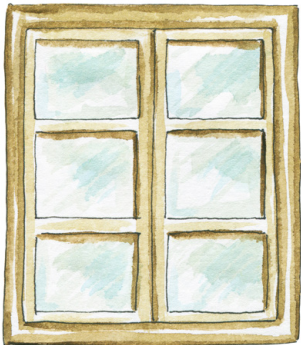

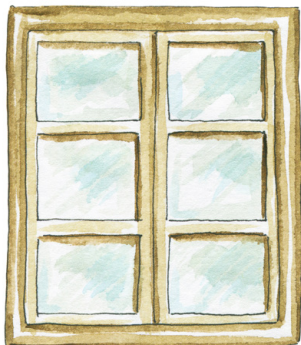

Receive two hours of hands on instructional training

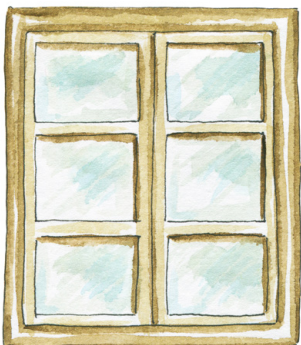
- What to do with a window painted shut
